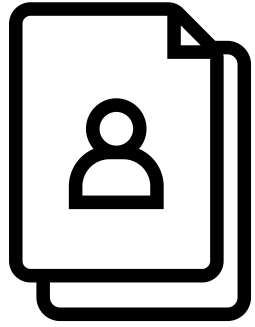

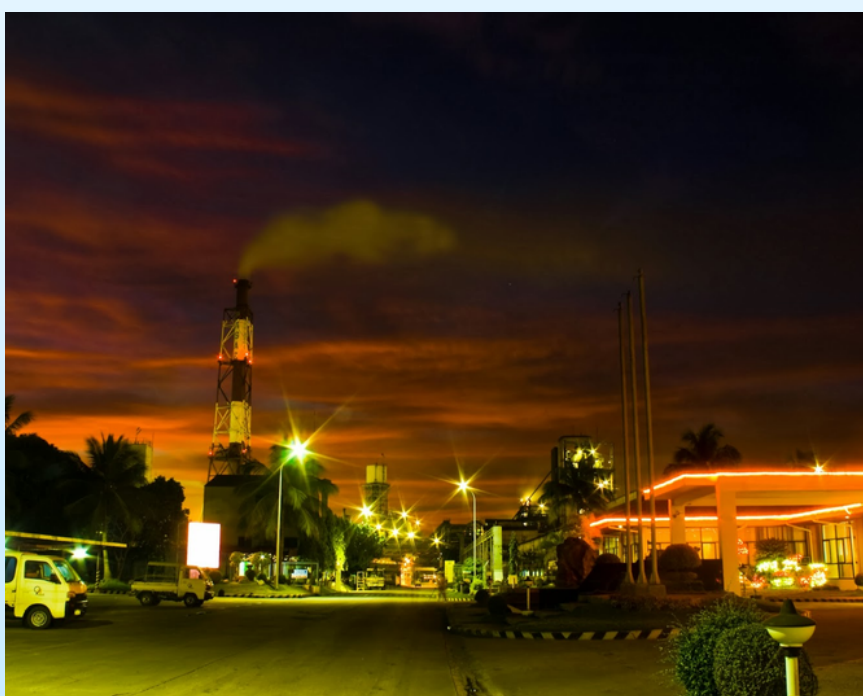
FIRST GEOTHERMAL POWERPLANT

Leyte Industrial Development Estate is situated in Isabel Leyte, near Ormoc. It houses the country's one and only Copper Smelting Plant.



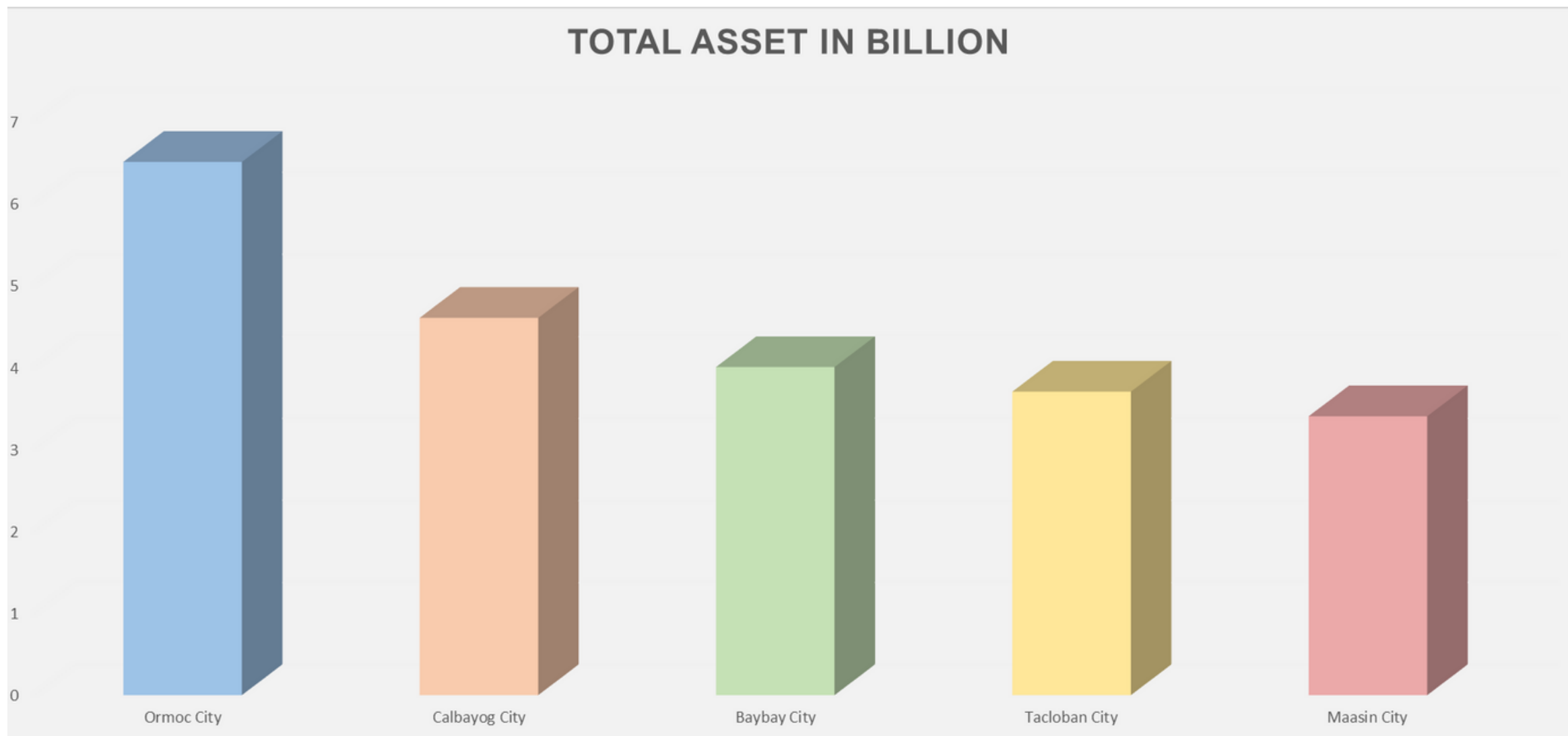

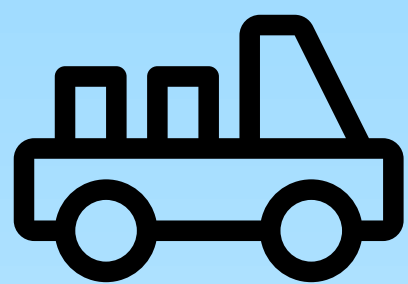

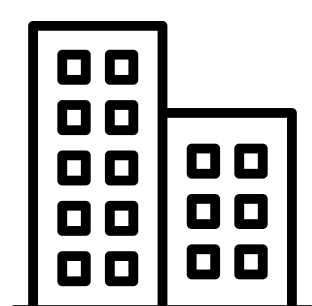

4. Sketch of Business Location

Free hand sketch is acceptable.

2. Pay the assessment.
3. Claim Permit and Business Registration Plate.

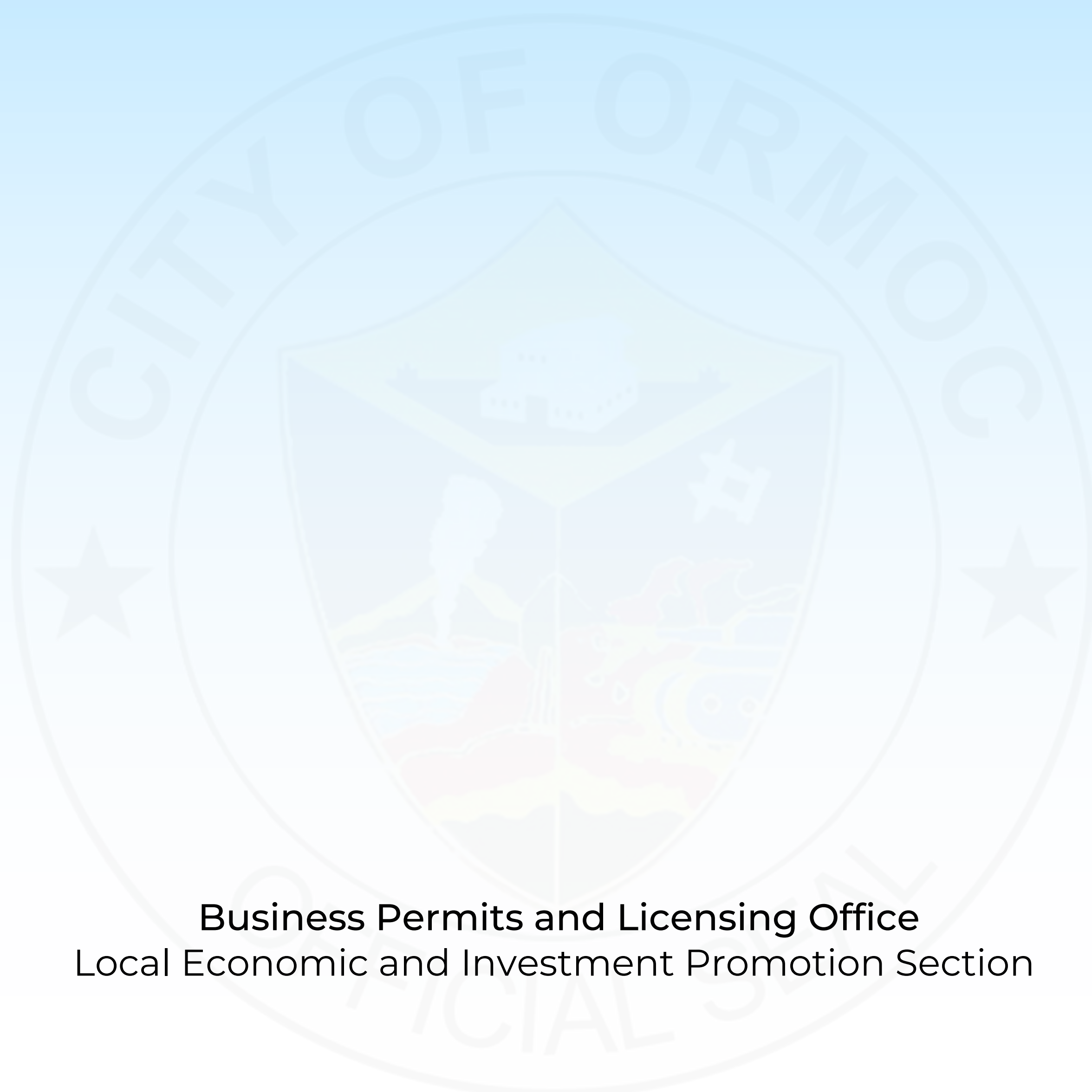
